

GGC Engineers, Inc. will be working with the **Village of Johnstown** to smoke test sewers in your area on August 25, 26 and 29.

The smoke is **NON-TOXIC, NON-STAINING, HAS NO ODOR, WHITE TO GRAY IN COLOR, CREATES NO FIRE HAZARD, AND IS NOT HARMFUL TO PETS.**

The smoke should not enter your building unless you have defective plumbing or dried up drain traps.

If you detect smoke in your building, ventilate the room by opening windows or doors. The smoke will dissipate quickly. If smoke enters your building and you need assistance, please notify the field technicians who are conducting the test.

Why is the Village conducting smoke testing?

The sanitary sewer system was not designed to handle storm water, nor was the storm sewer system designed to convey sanitary sewage charges.

Cross-connections between the sanitary and storm systems can result in unsanitary conditions or high treatment costs.

What if you get smoke in your house?

If you detect smoke in your building, ventilate the room by opening windows or doors. If you experience irritation caused by the smoke, leave the area and ventilate well to dissipate the smoke. Should smoke enter your building and you need assistance, please notify the field technicians who are conducting the test.
